Funding Purpose: The Comprehensive Anti-Gang Strategies and Programs initiative provides communities with funds to: (1) hire a multi-strategy gang coordinator to coordinate existing community-based anti-gang programs and strategies that are closely aligned with local law enforcement efforts; (2) implement or enhance existing evidence-based gang prevention, intervention, and suppression programs; and, (3) evaluate the implementation and impact of comprehensive community-based anti-gang strategies.

Overarching Goal: OJJDP's goal is to support the implementation of comprehensive community-based anti-gang strategies and to more efficiently coordinate the resources and activities that support them. Law enforcement is seen as an essential partner. Other partners should include schools, social services, faith- and community-based organizations, and businesses. OJJDP seeks comprehensive, long-term strategic approaches that contain the spread of gang activity; protects susceptible youth, and mitigates risk factors that foster gang activity. A sought-after four-pronged approach must include targeted enforcement of the most serious and chronic offenders, intervening with those youth already gang-involved, preventing entrance into gangs, and addressing risk and protective factors in high crime, gang linked areas.

# Never Give Up! Gang Juvenile Delinquency Prevention Initiative

## **Project Description:**

A growing number of communities have adopted OJJDP's Comprehensive Gang Model (CGM), a multi-strategy, multidisciplinary approach that has proven to be effective in reducing gang activity. Fresno County's Never Give Up! Gang & Juvenile Delinquency Prevention Initiative is to support the implementation of comprehensive community-based anti-gang strategies and to more efficiently coordinate the resources and activities that support them, thereby reducing gang activity in targeted communities. This will be achieved through the Five-Year Gang Prevention Strategic Plan (Strategic Plan).

The Strategic Plan includes five overarching goals aimed to reduce gang activity and violence through implementation of the core strategies of the Comprehensive Gang Model.

- 1) Build capacity in existing, effective, gang prevention and intervention programs.
- 2) Improve opportunities for at-risk youth and former gang members to participate in at least one positive development activity annually.
- 3) Establish a data and research analysis process to keep the Board of Supervisors, Committee and Community Action Teams aware of key gang trends, anti-gang research and programming on an ongoing basis.
- 4) Institute an effective coordinated and community-inclusive collaboration process to impact gang activity countywide.
- 5) Develop a sustainable funding strategy for the Strategic Plan

## **Partner Roles:**

### *County:*

Oversee grant administration for Strategic Plan. Oversee implementation of a countywide Steering Committee, and cross-community activities to include Assessment Research Partner, Evaluation, Training, and completion of an annual report. Oversee administration of Community Site Coordinators to include facilitation of regular community meetings, and coordination of development and implementation of strategic plan objectives.

### *Each Community:*

Develop a Community Action Team (CAT) or utilize current collaboration body to meet regularly and facilitate implementation of strategic plan activities within the community to include: identifying and supporting 25 gang-involved persons with social intervention and opportunities provision activities. CAT should consist of one Site Coordinator and representatives from: local government agencies, law enforcement agencies, schools, social service agencies, and community/faith-based agencies.

1) Community Mobilization; 2) Social Intervention, 3) Opportunities Provisions, 4) Targeted Law Enforcement, 5) Organizational Change and Development
- Endorsement of the County's Five Year Gang Prevention Strategic Plan
