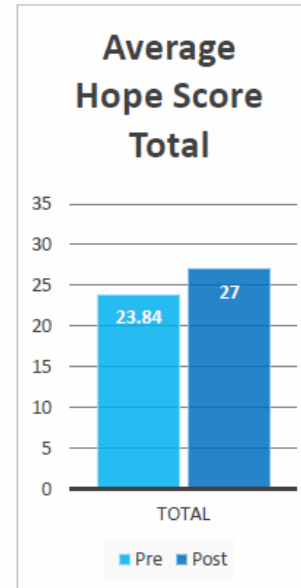
Children's Hope Scale All Sites 2014/2015



During the academic school year, 173 youth from Fresno County participated in the Children's Hope Scale. 148 of the youth also participated WRAP (Wellness Recovery Action Plan) program and the remaining 22 had WRAP concepts. The surveys evaluated for their "hopefulness" before and after.

The survey consisted of rating how much they related to 6 positive statements on a 1 – 6 scale.

Q1: I think I am doing pretty well.	1 = None of the time
Q2: I can think of many ways to get the things in life that are most important to me.	2 = A little of the time
Q3: I am doing just as well as other kids my age.	3 = Some of the time
Q4: When I have a problem, I can come up with lots of ways to solve it.	4 = A lot of the time
Q5: I think the things I have done in the past will help me in the future.	5 = Most of the time
Q6: Even when others want to quite, I know that I can find ways to solve the problem.	6 = All of the time



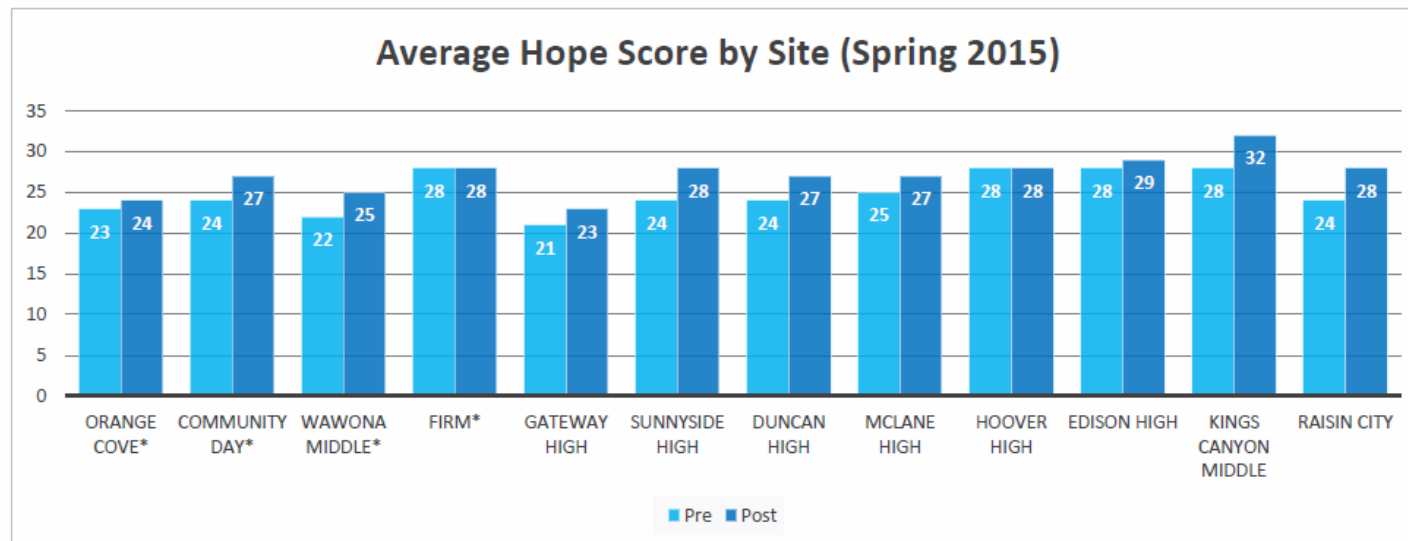
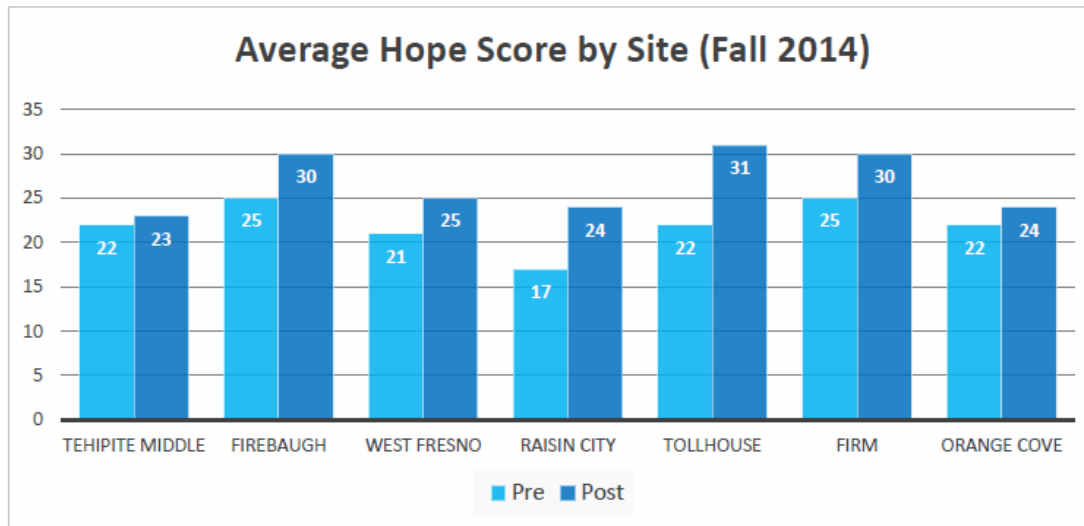
There was an average of 13.25% increase of Hope in the youth. The increased moved the average youth from answering the positive statements as "Some of the time" (3.95) to "A lot of the time" (4.50).

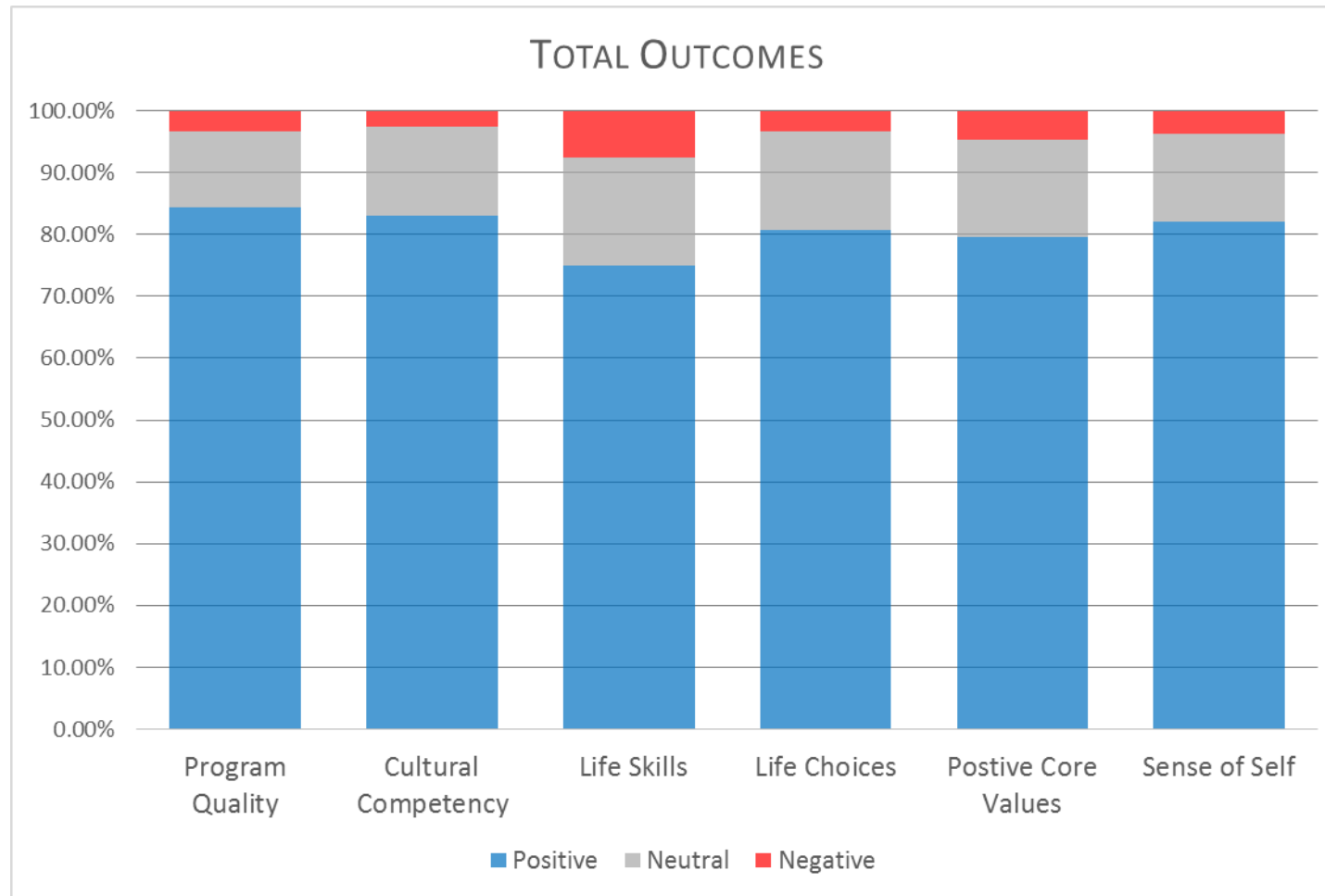
