I. TREATMENT

- A. ABCs Assessment and treatment.
- B. Consider spine immobilization if trauma.
- C. STAT transport if in shock.

NOTE: If in shock, time from onset to ALS is critical. Consider rendezvous with ALS unit enroute to hospital.

- D. If in shock, treat according to shock protocol.
- E. If evisceration:
 - 1. Cover area with large moist gauze abdominal pad.
 - 2. Maintain moistness with normal saline.
 - 3. Do not replace eviscerated organs.
 - 4. If uncontrollable bleeding, apply direct pressure.
- F. If penetrating wounds:
 - 1. Stop bleeding.
 - 2. Dress and bandage.
 - 3. Stabilize impaled objects with bulky dressing. **DO NOT REMOVE IMPALED OBJECT**.
- G. If blunt trauma:
 - 1. If in shock, treat as hypovolemia.
- H. Give nothing by mouth.
