CA Code of Regulations (CCR), Title 22, Section 65523 in part: The pool operator of every public pool open for use shall test the disinfection residual and pH of the public pool water a minimum of once per day. Shall test heated pools' water temperature a minimum of once per day. Shall maintain written daily record of all test results, equipment readings, calibrations, and corrective action taken at the pool site. If cyanuric acid is added to the pool, shall measure the cyanuric acid a minimum of once per month and shall maintain a written record of these test results and all corrective action taken at the public pool site. Shall maintain a written record of these test results and all corrective action, near-drowning, or drowning incident the pool operator shall record the incident in accordance with the requirements of section 65546 and maintain the record at the public pool site. Shall maintain data and records for at least two years for inspection by the enforcing agent and shall submit all data and records to the enforcing agent upon the agent's request.
