CSA 1 Survey Information

Update on Prop 218 for Water and Sewer Rate Increase:

- On June 29, 2019, the Tamarack community directed staff to move forward with a rate adjustment procedure (Prop 218 process) to increase water and sewer service fees to bring the CSA 1 cash balance out of the negative and to balance revenues with current operating expenses.
- Documents for the procedure were drafted and sent to County Counsel for review where
 we were informed that CSA law no longer allows water and sewer fees to be collected
 through tax assessments. This means that the District will now have to collect water and
 sewer services fees through <u>bi-monthly water and sewer bills</u>.
- Staff will continue to move forward with the water and sewer fee increase as planned. If approved by the Board of Supervisors, the new rates would not take effect until July 1, 2020 as the current water and sewer service fees for fiscal year 2019-20 have already been placed on your property tax rolls.
- Upon completion of County Counsel's review of the rate adjustment procedure documents, the County will hold another public meeting to discuss the process and answer any questions you may have.

Update on Options for Infrastructure Replacement:

- On June 29, 2019, financing options were discussed for water and sewer system improvements. The original financing options can be found on CSA 1 website https://www.co.fresno.ca.us/csa1 under "Community Meeting Presentation June 29, 2019."
- Since the meeting, a State representative from the Clean Water State Revolving Fund (CWSRF), wastewater loan side, has informed the County that planning loans are currently unavailable for wastewater projects. They also informed the department that since there is such a high demand for wastewater construction loans, the State is utilizing a priority-scoring checklist to determine which projects to fund.
- At this time, CSA 1's wastewater improvement project would not score high enough to qualify for funding. The cut-off for funding changes year to year and the County will continue to work with the State to access the best time to apply for financing.
- Since staff has identified the water infrastructure project as the priority project and because Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (DWSRF) loans are readily available, staff recommends pursuing funding for the water project.
- A brief review of the loan types (construction loan vs planning and construction loan) are displayed below, followed by cost information for each option.
