

CRESCENT VIEW WEST PUBLIC CHARTER, INC.

CONFLICT OF INTEREST CODE

The Political Reform Act (Government Code §81000, et seq.) requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (2 California Code of Regulations §18730) which contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code. After public notice and hearing, the standard code may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of 2 California Code of Regulations §18730 and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission are hereby incorporated by reference. This regulation and the attached Exhibits, designating positions and establishing disclosure categories, shall constitute the conflict of interest code of Crescent View West Public Charter, Inc. ("the Agency").

Members of the Governing Board and the Chief Executive Officer shall electronically file their Form 700 Statement of Economic Interests with the Fresno County Board of Supervisors. All other individuals holding designated positions shall file their Form 700 Statement of Economic Interests with the Agency. All statements will be available for public inspection and reproduction (Government Code §81008).

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In preparing the Form 700, designated filers need only disclose those financial interests falling within the disclosure categories designated for that filer's position as stated in Exhibits A and B.

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The Crescent View West Public Charter, Inc. Board of Directors hereby adopts this Conflict of Interest Code.



EXHIBIT B

DISCLOSURE CATEGORIES

Many of the terms below have specific meaning under the Political Reform Act. In addition, the financial interests of a spouse, domestic partner, and dependent children of the person holding the designated position may require reporting. Consult the instructions and reference pamphlet of the Form 700 for explanation.

Category 1:

Persons holding designated positions in this category shall disclose all investments and business positions in business entities and income (including gifts, loans, and travel payments) from sources that engage in the purchase or sale of real property, or are engaged in building construction or design within the geographic areas described below.

Persons in this category shall disclose all interest in real property where the property or any part of it is located: 1) within the county boundaries of an authorizing school district for a school governed by the Agency, 2) within two miles outside the county boundaries of an authorizing school district for a school governed by the Agency, or 3) within two miles of any property the Agency owns or utilizes (including any leasehold, beneficial or ownership interest, or option to acquire such interest).

Persons are not required to report a residence, such as a home or vacation cabin, used exclusively as a personal residence. However, a residence in which a person rents out a room, or for which a person claims a business deduction, may be reportable.

Category 2:

Persons holding designated positions in this category shall disclose all investments and business positions in business entities and income (including gifts, loans, and travel payments) from sources that engage in the performance of work or services of the type utilized by the Agency, or that manufacture, sell, repair, rent, or distribute school supplies, books, materials, school furnishings, or equipment of the type utilized by the Agency.
