

The Fresno County Innovation Plan planning process is coming to a close. We appreciate all who have participated in the process. Below is a summary of the changes made to the Innovation Plans that reflect the most current plan drafts.

The following changes have been to the three Innovation Plans post public hearing and public comment period:

INN-01

No major changes to the content of this plan were made. The changes that were made include:

- Reference to the inclusion of Crestwood was added
- Reference to collaboration with hospital staff and possible funding of partial staffing positions was added
- Inclusion of additional staff to the IDT was made. Those staff members include:
 - Admitting Interviewer
 - Provider Relations Specialist
 - Utilization Review Specialist
 - Psychiatrist/nursing staff dedicated time
 - Driver

INN-02

No major changes to the content of this plan were made. The changes that were made include:

- Reference to collaboration with hospital staff and possible funding of partial staffing positions was added
- Reference to the inclusion of Crestwood was added
- Reference to ER staff referring consumers to the Overnight Stay Facility was added
- The follow staffing changes were made:
 - Staffing listed in the plan previously was removed
 - Program Supervisor was added
 - Clinician time for emergency consultations was added
 - Staffing that will provide the needed supervision of consumers being discharged from the ER setting to an overnight stay facility was added.
 - Peer and Family Support was added
 - Linkage Specialists was added

INN-03

- Reference to providing “service” in the center was removed
- Reference to providing linkage, education, and awareness through the center was added
- Reference to the holistic center providing education of holistic approaches and alternative options for healing will be provided to the community and DBH was added
- Reference to the holistic center providing access to already existing and future culturally competent services was added
- Reference to the promotion of collaboration between traditional and non-traditional services was added
- A Holistic Center Advisory Counsel was added. Members of the counsel may include:
 - Representatives of the community
 - DBH staff
- The Advisory Counsel will provide:
 - Recommendations on design and development of the Holistic Center
 - Recommendations on services offered
 - Recommendation on general operations of the center
- Reference to the Holistic Center staff having knowledge of healers and cultural groups and leaders in Fresno County was added
- Reference to the Holistic Center staff providing education, linkage, and referral services was added
- Reference to alternative non-traditional holistic services to be provided will be determined by the Advisory Counsel was added
- Reference to learning being collective for those seeking possible alternative healing/holistic options as well as educate those that are treatment providers, first responders and others regarding options and interest as brought up by the consumer/individual being seen was added
- Developing the Holistic Center Advisory Counsel was added to the timeline
- Additional outcome measurement to include reporting of culturally/linguistically competent documentation in consumer records (of those engaged in ‘traditional’ care) due to the increased awareness and possible linkages based on consumer input was added to the project measurements
