<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 80% of youth advancing to Stage 2 of the Juvenile Behavioral Health Court (JBHC) will successfully graduate from the program. <p>Minors must comply with the following for three (3) months to progress to Stage 2 of the JBHC:</p> <p>1) Compliance with the direction of parent/guardian in the home; 2) Positive school attendance; 3) Participate in monthly school assessments; 4) Active involvement in the treatment plan; 5) Attend all court dates as scheduled; 6) Compliance with terms and conditions of the court; and 7) Improvement in school grades.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Reduce recidivism of program participants who have in the past been repeat juvenile offenders due to oversight of Behavioral Health Issues. • Improvement in coping skills, education, discipline and behavior. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • 42 of the 50 (84%) clients that have separated from the program after advancing to Stage 2 of the JBHC have successfully graduated from the program. • Only two of the 42 graduates that have successfully completed the program have re-offended and appeared in the justice system. • 100% of the participants that

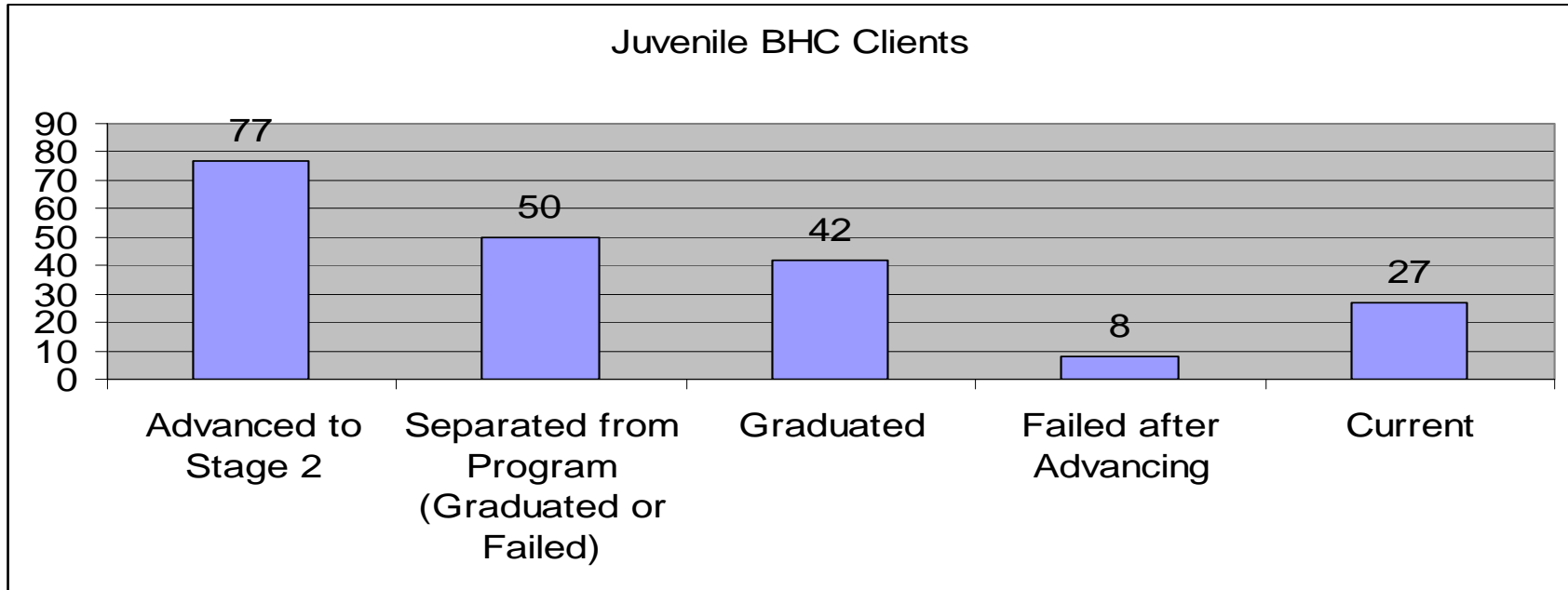
	successfully graduated showed improved grades, attended required therapy, and showed consistent improvement in behavior skills.

Not every minor who is eligible will be accepted into the JBHC. The JBHC team will review and discuss all relevant information regarding the minor's suitability for the JBHC. The team will consider the following factors in determining the minor's suitability for the JBHC:

- 1) The minor's prior psychiatric/mental health history;
- 2) The minor's amenability to treatment;
- 3) Whether the minor

has a history of problems, including violent, aggressive or assault related behavior; 4) Whether the minor has a history of problems in school, either learning and/or behavior; 5) Whether the minor has family or community support systems in place; 6) Whether the minor is motivated to participate in treatment; and 7) Additional factors may be considered on a case-by-case basis.

A minor would be terminated after being accepted to the program for the following reasons:

1) No longer suitable based on the above criteria; 2) The minor/parents/guardian no longer wishes to participate; 3) The minor does not take advantage of all the services offered; 4) The minor continues to violate probation; and 5) The minor fails to follow court orders.

Also, these are the most common reasons the JBHC would successfully terminate a minor:

1) Minor who moves out of town; or 2) Minor no longer needs the JBHC intensive services but is left on regular probation, etc.
