

Student Election Worker FAQs

What do Student Election Workers do?

- Student Election Workers help set-up the Vote Center; greet voters; assist with the voting process and assist with the closing of the polls.

What are the duties of a Student Election Worker?

- Assist with Vote Center set-up; greet voters, receive ballots from voters; assist voters with voting equipment, and assist with closing the Vote Center.
- Assist with drive-thru sites, which is set up outdoors, for voters who are dropping off their voted Vote by Mail Ballot.

How should I dress?

- Business casual is recommended; keep in mind that it will be a long day so dress comfortably and appropriately. No jeans, tennis shoes or logo/sports themed attire.

What are the hours?

- Vote Centers are open on multiple days 9am to 5pm and on Election Day 7am to 8pm. Student Election Workers report to their assigned location to assist with set up before the Vote Center opens and are required to work until all closing procedures are done.

What if I have cheer practice, band practice, etc.? Am I allowed to leave early?

- Unfortunately, we do not schedule our Student Election Workers to work a partial shift. Students who are unable to commit to a full day should not apply.

Do we get a lunch and dinner break?

- Yes, all Student Election Workers will receive lunches and breaks.

How much do I get paid and when will I receive my check?

- Student Election Workers receive an hourly rate of pay. Checks are typically mailed 4-6 weeks after the election.
